

4-H Fruit Sales Tips

- ✿ Thanksgiving fruit orders will arrive on Monday, November 23rd. Christmas fruit orders will arrive on Monday, December 14th. Make sure you check either Thanksgiving or Christmas fruit delivery on the order form.
- ✿ Turn in all Thanksgiving Orders by November 16th. Turn in Christmas orders by December 7th.
- ✿ All 4-H club members should strive to sell at least 10 cases!
- ✿ Cases will not be divided! Cases smaller than ½ bushel will not be sold.
- ✿ Payment can be cash or check. Checks should be made payable to 'Carroll County 4-H Adult Council'. Payment is expected at time of pick-up and/or delivery.
- ✿ Fruit pick-up will be at 'Virginia Produce' in the Carroll County Industrial Park. The salesperson will be responsible for delivering fruit to their customers if the customer does not come to pick it up.
- ✿ 4-H Club Members are responsible for collecting money due from customers.
- ✿ When the customer pays for their fruit, turn the money in ASAP. Do not spend it!
- ✿ Profit for fruit will be based on the percentage that your club sells. For example, if your club sells 25% of the total orders, then your club receives 25% of the profit. Your club has to sell at least 15 cases to receive profit. Profit will not be paid until all money has been turned in. To receive profit, you must have your 4-H club name in the '4-H Club' space on the order form. If you forget to indicate the '4-H Club', profit is forfeited for that order.
- ✿ Profit will be awarded to each participating club after all money has been turned in.
- ✿ The top fruit salesperson will be recognized and will receive a monetary award equal to \$100.
- ✿ Please write legibly on the order form.
- ✿ Sell to friends, family, teachers, neighbors, church members, etc. Sell door-to-door but do not sell alone. Remember to explain how fruit fundraising benefits you and your 4-H club. Without fruit sales, many free 4-H functions and trips would cost you to participate.
