Junior Camp is open to all youth 9-13 (at least 9 years old by September 30, 2010) Youth whose 13th birthday is after 1-1-10 but before October 1, 2010 may enroll as a camper or a Counselor in Training. Youth 13 (as of 1-1-10) must apply to attend as a Counselor in Training. This introductory program is designed for young teens interested in leadership training. Price: \$230

Before You Decide

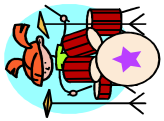

The facilities include air conditioned cabins and lodges, swimming pool with diving board, a health clinic, air rifle and archery ranges, boardwalk, 100 foot pier, amphitheater for campfire programs, basketball courts and picnic pavilions.
