Q. What can I do at camp?

A. Camp activities include swimming, water polo, crafts, campfires, survival skills, fun shops, sports, and many other fun events.

Q. How do I get to camp?

A. Bus transportation is provided.

Q. Where do we sleep?

A. You will sleep in bunk beds in air-conditioned cabins.

Q. Can my parents visit me at camp?

A. Parents are discouraged from visiting. Visits can cause home sickness and disrupt the day's schedule. For emergencies, please call prior to coming.

Q. Do I have to be a 4-H member in order to go to camp?

A. No. You will become enrolled as a 4-H member if you go to camp.

Q. Can I visit the camp site prior to going to camp?

A. Yes. An Open House will be held at the camp on June 1. It's FREE and anyone is welcome to attend. It's a great time to explore the camp site.

Q. How can I become a Counselor-In-Training (CIT)?

A. Those age 13 can attend camp and take CIT classes to learn to be a Teen Camp Counselor.

Q. Will a pre-camp meeting be held for campers?

A. Yes. A camper/parent Orientation is to be announced. It's your chance to get to know each other, get tips on packing, learn what to expect at camp, and get ALL your questions answered.
