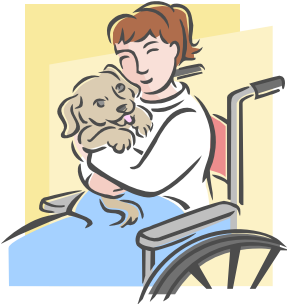

Where we go:

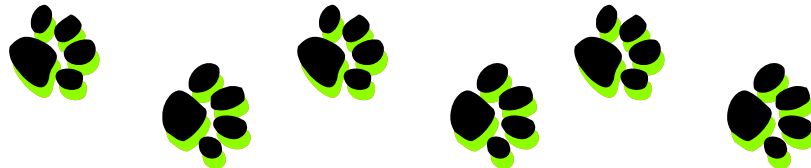
We support facilities such as;
