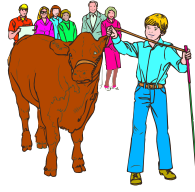
Youth learn all aspects of dog care, obedience, agility and showmanship and compete in local and state shows.

Youth Gardening



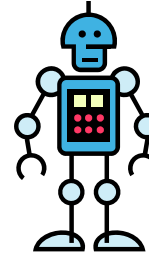
After-school program where youth learn concepts of gardening, horticulture and the interrelationships between plants, animals and soil.

New Clubs are easy to start and always welcome! They can be started for any common interest with 5 or more young people ages 9-19 led by a trained adult leader. Clubs meet for at least six 1-hour sessions during the year and have a planned program.

4-H is a community of young people across America who are learning leadership, citizenship and life skills.



What is 4-H?

4-H is a voluntary, informal education program for boys and girls who are ages 9-19. To enroll, participants must turn 9 between October 1st and September 30th. 4-H is open to everyone regardless of race, color, religion, sex, age, veteran status, national origin, handicap or political affiliation. Additionally, 4-H Cloverbuds is a program for youth ages five to eight.



4-H Camp

4-H Camp is another program available to youth in King George. Applications will be released late February, and camp is in July at the Northern Virginia 4-H Center. It's 5 days of fun and learning without electronics and TV!
