You can also join the Horse Judging and Hippology Team. This group judges horses, and learns everything from breeds to gaits and even equipment used around horses!

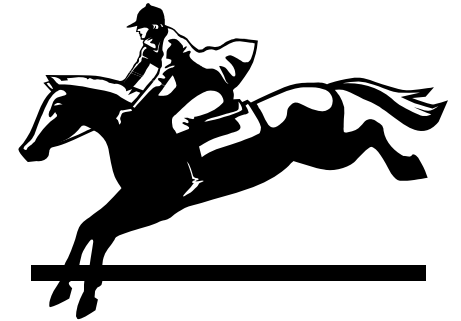
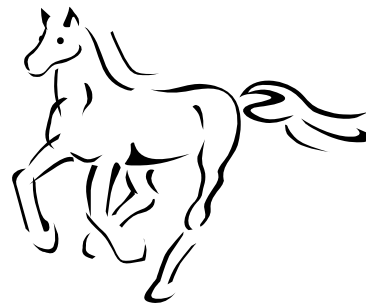
